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MAY IT PLEASE THE PANEL:

1. Freemans Bay Residents Association Inc is Submitter No. 2201 on Plan Change 78.

2. Amongst various issues raised is the appropriateness of applying a qualifying

matter in respect of roading to Freemans Bay on the basis that the already

congested and undersized traffic network is not capable of servicing development

or occupation of the area at the levels required by the 2020 NPS-UD and 2021

"Enabling" Act.

3. As previously advised to the Panel, Auckland Council has now acknowledged that

the qualifying matter work relating to transport at Beachlands was part of the

outcome in which "100 Zones" were analysed in relation to their possible QM

Transport status.

4. At some stage it will be necessary for the Panel to understand the traffic multiplier

that Auckland Council has employed for the purposes of its QM Transport analysis

at Beachlands and in the "100 Zones". The methodology applied by Auckland

Council in undertaking its assessment of QM Transport requirements could

usefully be litigated in the hiatus period during which the other infrastructure

assessments are being undertaken. It could inform any further s32 analysis that

should be completed.
